



## Accounting report for Nordic Sociological Association 2016-2017

The economy of the Nordic Sociological Association (NSA) is healthy and strong.

The Association had an equity of 979 222,43 NOK per 1.1.2016. The equity has been accumulated over several years, partly due to an increase in royalties for Acta Sociologica. Although budgeting for a deficit 2016 and 2017, we ended up with a surplus these years. On the one hand, the Association has spent significantly less in project funding than according to the budget, due to a small number of incoming applications and few projects initiated by the Board. On the other hand, the Association received a surplus from the NSA2016 conference in Helsinki and a signing bonus for signing a new publishing contract for Acta Sociologica.

### The general features of the Nordic Sociological Association accounting

- NSA has two bank accounts, one high-interest account and one checking account. Both accounts are in the bank DnB (formerly Den Norske Bank) in Norway.
- NSA has no debt.
- The primary sources of cost for the NSA are:
  - the cost for running the editorial work for Acta
  - the costs related to the board (with two board meeting/year)
  - conferences and project
  - operating expenses
- Variations in costs between years are in part due to where the board meetings are held. Board meetings at the Nordic Sociological Congress are often more expensive than ordinary board meetings.
- Accounting Procedures:
  - The treasurer accounts for payments and makes all entries via online banking.
  - Accounting status reports are presented at every board meeting.
  - The treasurer submits a draft budget for the following financial year for the board to approve.
  - The annual accounts are audited by a certified accountant every second year.

### Comments

#### Revenues

- **Membership fees:** All national associations have paid for 4 annual numbers of Acta
- **Royalties:** We have received full royalty for each year. The exchange rate between £ and NOK is the main reason for the variation between the two years.
- **Other revenues:** This line is due to a surplus from the NSA2016 Congress in Helsinki, and a signing bonus from SAGE after signing a new contract for ACTA.

#### Expenditure

- Supported projects 2016:
  - Mapping sociology in the Nordic countries
  - Pre-conference in Helsinki, NSA2016 congress



- Student participation in Helsinki, NSA2016 congress
- Supported projects 2017:
  - Nordic STS conference Gothenburg
- There was a higher expense on board meetings in 2017 than budgeted. It is the aim of the board to have meetings in the different member countries on turn, and because of the NSA2018 conference the board decided to advance a board meeting in Iceland from 2018 to 2017. As expected board meetings in Iceland are more expensive due to higher travel expenses and accommodation
- *Other expenses* are mainly costs for juridical expertise in the negotiation with SAGE 2016 and 2017 (in total 45 063 NOK) and to a case of economic fraud committed against the association in 2017 (33 153 NOK).
